



## Filmed and Not Forgotten: ASFF and Yorkshire Film Archive

## **Present a Centenary Commemoration**

Archival footage of Yorkshire residents, workers and servicemen made before, during and after the First World War will be shown in York as part of a nationwide commemoration for the centenary of the war.

Visitors to the Aesthetica Short Film Festival will be able to share in the memories of the region as Yorkshire Film Archive and ASFF collaborate to present *Filmed and Not Forgotten*, an exhibition of historic films from communities around the area. Selected from their collection of over 50,000 moving images from 1890 to the present day, Yorkshire Film Archive's footage offers a rare and treasured glimpse into the personal and everyday moments of people from Yorkshire during the time of the war.

The event is a poignant reminder of the individuals who gave their lives and efforts to the country in 1914. Taking place in the afternoon of Remembrance Sunday, the commemorative screening connects us to them - snapshots of moments observed and remembered one hundred years later, significant not only to the current residents of Yorkshire, but to the nation.

Showing at the National Centre for Early Music, tickets to the memorable event are included with screening passes and 50% of individual ticket sales will go to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal, a charity assisting British servicemen and women and supporting those in need.

On the centenary of the First World War, we also remember those nations currently struggling for peace and this year the Aesthetica Short Film Festival also endeavours to present contemporary work from countries whose residents do not necessarily have as much opportunity or freedom to exhibit their work internationally. Guest screenings include films from Iraq and Lebanon.
